

## INDIANA TECH FEE CLASSIFICATIONS

**Tuition** - The Board of Trustees approves tuition in the spring of each year for the following academic year. The average range for full-time class load is 12-17 hours.

**Housing Deposit** - All students living in the university residence halls pay a housing deposit. This deposit is held as a reservation fee until move in and then as a security against damages to furnishings or other fees assessed the student as outlined in the Housing Regulations and Residence Hall Policies. The deposit is refundable when a student fulfills the terms of the contract and provides notice of their intent to no longer live on campus by May 1<sup>st</sup> for upcoming fall semesters or by December 1<sup>st</sup> for spring semesters. Charges will be assessed against the deposit for damages, cleaning, or lost keys where necessary. Refundable deposits will first be applied to any outstanding balance owed the university.

**Housing** - Costs vary according to which residence hall is assigned.

- Pierson Center cost includes room and 19 meals per week.
- Evans-Kimmell Hall cost includes room and 19 meals per week.
- Oropeza Hall cost includes room and 19 meals per week.
- Yergens-Rogers Hall cost is room only –this hall is for upper-class students only
- Warrior Row cost is room only –this hall is for upper-class students only

**Meal Options** - The university dining hall offers several meal options to students who reside in Yergens-Rogers Hall, Warrior Row, or off campus. The dining hall serves 19 meals per week (3 per day Monday – Friday, 2 on Saturday, 2 on Sunday)

- Students may purchase meals on a cash basis at the time of service in the dining hall.
- Students may purchase the Meal Plan (19 meals per week) for a full semester charge. This plan is for all of the meals that are offered in the dining hall.
- Students may purchase a 50 or 100 Meal Card through the Business Office. These can be used for any of the meals offered in the dining hall. Additional meal cards can be purchased throughout the year from the Business Office during regular office hours.

**Program Fee** - A tuition differential (program fee) is included per semester for students who major in engineering and sciences, computer sciences, or education due to the increased cost to operate these programs.

**Student Services Fee** - This fee funds student life activities, including Wicked Wednesdays, Spring Bling Fling, and many others held throughout the year. In addition, this fee funds technology upgrades and enhancements for students on our campus, such as additional computer labs, wireless connectivity, and much more.

**Late Registration/Processing** - A fee will be assessed to continuing students if registration and financial arrangement is not completed before the first day of class.

**Parking Fee** – This is payable through the outside agency handling the parking permits. All motor vehicles must be registered and a parking fee paid to entitle a student’s vehicle to be parked on campus. Parking on campus is restricted to properly tagged vehicles and designated parking lots; all others will be subject to being ticketed or towed. Every student must complete the Parking Permit Acceptance/Waiver Form and submit it to the Business Office.

**Fines and Damage Charges** - Students are billed for residence hall fines, library fines and lost books, and various other services. Billing is based on charge tickets issued by the department providing the service or supplies. Students must pay fines that appear on their bill by the due date listed on the bill. Students who do not pay bills in full will have financial and registration holds placed on their account.

**Student Identification Card** - All students are required to have a student identification card. The original card is issued at the beginning of the first year of attendance and is free. A fee is charged for the replacement of the ID card.

**Books** - Tuition includes textbook rental. The required textbooks will be distributed at the beginning of each semester. All students must sign a Textbook Rental Agreement at the time of distribution. This agreement states that all textbooks must be returned in good condition no later than Friday, the week of finals each semester. If any books are lost, damaged, or not returned by the designated time each semester, the student’s tuition account will be charged for the books plus tax.

**Health Insurance** - All full-time registered students are required to be covered under a health insurance plan. All students will automatically be enrolled in the Student Accident and Sickness Insurance Program and a premium fee assessed to their tuition account unless a signed waiver form is completed and returned to the Business Office along with proof of current insurance coverage (a copy of the front and back of insurance card).

**In-room Land Line Phone Lease** – Students who live in any of the university residence halls may lease a university owned land line phone for their room. Long distance calls will be blocked from these lines. Leased phones must be returned to the IT department prior to the student leaving campus for the academic year. Any student not returning the phone or whose phone is lost or stolen will be assessed the replacement cost.
